

Minimum Performance Standard (MPS) Info Sheet

What is the MPS?

The MPS is a Minimum Performance Standard which is used by Shooting Australia to assist in the selection of National Teams

How is the MPS used?

The MPS is used as a key driver when selecting National Teams and to determine whether an athlete is eligible for selection. Your Average Performance Score (APS) is measured against the MPS for your relevant event to determine eligibility for selection. When your APS meets or exceeds the relevant MPS, you are able to be considered for selection.

Where do I find the MPS?

Different events will have a different MPS, so it is important that you read the Selection Criteria for the relevant National Team you are looking to gain selection to. The Selection Criteria for upcoming events can be found [here](#).

When does my APS get judged against the MPS?

The Selection Criteria for specific international competitions will outline exactly when you need to have your APS at a particular minimum standard to be eligible for selection however it will typically be just after the last domestic event in the selection series for each competition.
