1. WHAT IS THE SHOOTING AUSTRALIA PERFORMANCE SERIES?

A Shooting Australia domestic competition series held within a specified period of time (eg a calendar year) shall form a Performance Series. These events will typically be held in conjunction with a Club, State Association or National Association and will include ISSF events across the Pistol, Rifle, Shotgun and Fullbore disciplines. All the events that form part of the Performance Series will be Endorsed Events.

The Performance Series will also provide a platform to encourage greater competitive participation throughout the ISSF disciplines.

During the Performance Series, Athletes (Competitors) will be awarded points based on where they finish in the Competition. Although there is no minimum number of Events that an Athlete must attend within the Performance Series of Events, the greater the number of events attended increases the opportunity to secure Performance Series points.

At the conclusion of the Performance Series, each Athlete with the greatest number of points in the event/s they compete in, will be awarded the winner and a presentation made during the 2021 Shooting Australia Awards of Excellence.

2. DETERMINING AN ENDORSED EVENT

In the assessment of which events will be Endorsed Events and therefore be part of the Performance Series, Shooting Australia has considered the following:

- What number of events are required in a given year, to provide selection opportunities for National Teams as well as adequate opportunities for the purposes of developing Athletes in National Squads?
- What events already exist in the calendar that Shooting Australia can endorse?
- Are there any further events required in a given year, to provide selection opportunities for National Teams as well as adequate opportunities for the purposes of developing Athletes in National Squads?
- Which ranges can facilitate competitions to ISSF standards and/or the endorsement of an event can assist the range/facility development to reach these standards?
- In consideration of the above, how can Shooting Australia ensure a fair allocation of Endorsed Events nationally?

4. WHO CAN COMPETE IN THE PERFORMANCE SERIES?

Any Able-Bodied Athlete or Para Athlete who competes in ISSF, WSPS and Fullbore disciplines is able to compete in the Performance Series of Events.

The Performance Series offers Athletes an all-inclusive and unique opportunity to participate in a national domestic series of Events. Throughout the Performance Series, the aim is to increase the opportunities for Athletes to participate in high quality domestic competitions. This can mean differing things for different Competitors including a training platform for National Team Members or a pathway into ISSF competitions from a Non ISSF Target Shooting Sport discipline.

All athletes will be expected to adhere to the ISSF rules and para Shooting athletes will also be required to adhere to the WSPS rules. Fullbore events will be conducted under the NRAA Standard Shooting Rules.

5. CALCULATING THE PERFORMANCE SERIES POINTS

At each Performance Series event athletes will be awarded Performance Series Points based on their finishing position only. Performance Series Points are awarded from 1st place to 15th place.

At the conclusion of the Performance Series, the athlete who has accumulated the most Performance Series Points in each of the Events, shall be recognised as the winner of the Performance Series.

A leaderboard will be displayed on the Shooting Australia website and updated at the conclusion of each competition.

The Performance Series points tally is only relative to the Performance Series and is in no way associated with the selection of any Athletes to a National Team.

International Federation count back rules for each relevant discipline will be used to determine places if required.

5.2 Performance Series Prizes

Shooting Australia will provide Gold, Silver and Bronze Medals for each of the Performance Series Events. The Host (Club, State Association or National Association) is responsible for any additional prizes awarded whether by direct contribution or sponsorship.

The Performance Series winners will be announced during the 2021 Shooting Australia Awards of Excellence and presented with their prize.
