

## Online Air Rifle 60 Shots Open Performance Series Competitions February 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> 2021

The following requirements need to be followed for inclusion into the Online Air Rifle Performance Series competitions:

### ***Competition Preparation***

1. There should be one designated person in the external location who will be responsible for the competition in that location – Competition Organiser. They will liaise with National Coaches regarding entries from that location and ensure the smooth running of the competition.
2. The Competition Organiser can promote the online event in their location, and take the entries from athletes, and pass this on to National Coaches.
3. The external location needs to have internet access to ensure that at least one camera (mobile phone) can be set up with a clear view of the athletes who are shooting. This should be projected onto a screen so that athletes can see other athletes who are shooting.
4. A PC with access to the internet will be required to access a Google Drive document that is prepared by National Coaches. This could be connected to a monitor large enough that all athletes and spectators can see what other athletes are shooting.
5. Each competition location needs to have electronic target machines, and an appropriate Range Officer who is independent from the athletes.
6. Entry fees for the online entries will be up to the Competition Organiser from each location – we suggest just normal range fee to the hosting range. There is no additional fee to Shooting Australia. Entries to the National Coaches by email no later than Thursday February 11<sup>th</sup>, 2021.
7. The competition will be run on Zoom, and links for the competitions will be sent out to you when they are arranged.

### ***Competition***

1. The competition will be conducted at the same time nationwide. The start time will be 9.30am both days Adelaide time which will be
  - a. 10am Sydney, Melbourne, (half an hour ahead of Adelaide)
  - b. 9am Brisbane (half an hour behind Adelaide)
  - c. 7am Perth (two and a half hours behind Adelaide)
2. The competition will follow ISSF time calls and rules.
3. All time calls will be called from Adelaide. The location Range Officers may need to repeat the time calls for the athletes.
4. Scores will be entered on the Google Drive document as they are shot, so that everyone can see the progress of all athletes. Link to this will also be sent to you soon.
5. Scores from all online locations will form one overall scoresheet for the competition, and the top 8 athletes will go into the online final. This means there could be finalists from all over the country participating.
6. The final will be called from Adelaide, and the Google Drive Doc will be used again for keeping track of scores. It will not be as spontaneous as a face to face final, but it will be better than none at all.
